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POLICY

In order to confirm enrollment, CCV students must meet their financial responsibilities to the college at the time of registration by either paying tuition and fees in full or verifying alternative methods of payment.

PROCEDURES

1. Students with outstanding debts to the college are not permitted to register.
2. Transcripts and diplomas will be withheld from students with outstanding debts.
3. Alternative methods of payment include:
 - a. Financial Aid
Registrations covered by financial aid must be authorized by a financial aid counselor.
 - b. Third Party Payment, Agency and/or Employer Payment
Registrations covered by agency and/or employer payment must be accompanied by written authorization that specifies the amount of payment sponsored by the third party; the authorization must be without stipulations (e.g. successful completion of the course, obtaining a certain grade). Students will be liable for all costs if a third party fails to honor its sponsorship.
 - c. Waivers and Scholarships
Registrations covered by waivers or scholarships must be accompanied by written authorization that specifies the amount of payment sponsored or waived.
 - d. College-approved payment plan.
4. CCV complies with VA regulations. As such, individuals who are eligible for chapter

31 or chapter 33 benefits and have submitted a certificate of eligibility and a request for enrollment certification are eligible to attend and participate in courses and related academic services while CCV awaits payment from the VA.
